

This guide sets out a brief summary of the process to agree a sanction with the ITIA for your reference. You must decide whether to accept or reject the ITIA's offered sanction and respond within 10 business days.

We strongly recommend you urgently seek legal advice. You or your advisers should also refer to the accompanying letter and the TACP which take precedence over this summary document.

1

The ITIA believes you have committed a Corruption Offense(s). (see paragraph A of the accompanying letter)

2

The potential sanctions should your case proceed to a hearing could be up to a life suspension from participating in professional tennis and a \$250,000 fine. (see paragraph B of the accompanying letter)

3

The ITIA is offering you the opportunity to admit the offense(s) alleged by the ITIA and accept an agreed sanction at this stage which incorporates discounts for your early admission.

(see paragraph C of the accompanying letter)

You do not have to accept the proposal and can instead choose to have your case resolved at a hearing before an independent AHO. You should note that the AHO may impose a higher sanction which will not include the discount for early admission being proposed by the ITIA now. Do you wish to accept the ITIA's proposal? Sign the bottom of the letter and send a copy to cases@itia.tennis within 10 business days. You may also be provisionally suspended pending determination Matters already before an AHO of the matter. will be finalised immediately. You may not later appeal your sanction.
